Greetings to all of our Friends and Supporters of the IAF,

2023 has been an unusual year for the International Anglican Fellowship. There has been a lot of good news which I can share with you in this issue of 'The Mission' as well as some disappointing news that you ought to know about.

First, some of the good news—
A few months back in June the Traditional Anglican Church, the IAF's parent Church, provisionally welcomed two new Dioceses located in Brazil to our worldwide church They are the Diocese of Natal and the Diocese of Sao Paulo and Parana—along with their

respective bishops, The Rt. Rev. Albertino de Sousa Barreiros and the Right Rev. Itabira Jonas.

In other news, the newest mission church of the IAF, the Farsi Mission in Indonesia, has continued to grow under the leadership of Fr. James Long and Chistian Lucman. Christian is the onthe-scene administrator in Indonesia for the Farsi Mission. The Farsi Mission's goal is to provide Anglican services to Farsi speaking refugees from Iran and Pakistan along with Moslem Indonesian converts to Christianity. Mission work in Indonesia is sometimes quite dangerous and members are advised to keep their identities secret by using only first names

In other good news, a brand new Anglican Church building is being constructed in Western Guatemala. The Church of the Transfiguration's new construction activity was recently blessed with its new roof, via the IAF, through a special designated grant from the ACA Diocese of the Missouri Valley. In this way, and in many other ways, individuals and churches are making a tremendous difference in the lives of thousands of people around the world in the form of designated grants to the IAF.

This year though, due to the tightening

of the money supply and lingering doubts about inflation, the IAF has been increasingly concerned with meeting next years' budgeting obligations, Of the 62 sustaining members of the IAF, only 45 have responded to the call so far this year and nearly half of those have not yet made their full commitment. In years past, the IAF has often given out more than it has taken in by several hundred dollars, but this year we will be thousands of dollars behind. What this means is that the 2024 grant system may have to be adjusted if things continue that way the present year is shaping up.

So, if you are a Sustaining Member, please do your best in the coming months to help make up the difference. And if you are a not sustaining member, please consider becoming one, by sending in a monthly, Quarterly, or Annual donation in any amount. It will be gratefully received and wisely distributed.

The IAF is one of very few charitable organizations in the world where 96% of the income received goes out directly to the people and programs that are most in need.

Report to the IAF from Southern Africa from Archbishop Michael Gill

Southern Africa was particularly hard hit by Covid-19, and although the threat has receded, the impact of Covid-19 is still being felt in many areas of church life. During Covid-19 we lost six Priests in South Africa and one Bishop in Zambia, something which has been devastating to us as a region. Priests are not easy to replace, and Bishops even more so!

Zambia

The loss of Bishop Andrew Mukuyamba has severely hurt church growth in Zambia, as the episcopal work is having to be taken up by the South African Bishops. We have a visit planned for end of October 2023, but this is tentative, due to Bishop Augustine Koliti's current ill-health. The visit will include clergy meetings and Confirmations, something which will bring clarity to us and accelerate the growth of the church once again.

South Africa

Covid-19 restrictions were severe in South Africa, with public places being closed and funerals limited to no more than 50 persons. We still take particular care in the use of the Chalice, with the preferred method of taking Holy Communion being to dip the wafer due to the risk of infection being relatively high.

Only now, nearly a year after restrictions have been lifted, are people beginning to come back to church. The closure of churches for worship severely impacted church finances, as rural and township churches have always relied on the collection plate for income, unlike more sophisticated communities where electronic banking is available.

As churches have become more active, we have been pleased to see people beginning to return to worship and the number of young people coming forward for Confirmation has also increased.

Bishop Koliti will be doing two Confirmations during September in the Eastern Cape region of Tsolo, while Archbishop Gill has been visiting parishes for Confirmation in other parts of the country. This will continue as we receive more and more requests for visitations and Confirmations.

He still needs some additional support on the ground but I am praying God will provide it. I plan, as God allows, to return to Indonesia for Rev. Aan's ordination as Presbyter late November. We shall see how it comes together. Prayers requested for the restart of our Bali

campus. There is a group there with Anglican tendencies and I can probably send preachers there, but it will require some money. Not sure where that will come from but I know if God is in it he will provide.


PAC has hosted around 6 short term mission teams from Taiwan and Hong Kong this year. The teams have worked with both refugee camps and the impoverished of Indonesia.

The IAF Sustaining Member program was begun in 2012 as a tool to formally recognize those churches and individuals that support the Fellowship on a recurring basis. For example, if one of the line items in a church budget contains a donation to the IAF, that church is eligible to become a Sustaining Member. Similarly, individuals or families who

desire to provide support on a regular basis can be recognized as Sustaining Members.

This program helps to give the IAF Board of Directors an idea of how to plan distribution of donated funds for TAC missionary projects and to target those projects that are most in need. As a token of appreciation, Sustaining Members are presented with a wall plaque (shown to the right) ... a tangible example of commitment and caring.
